COMPLETED AND CLOSED ACTIONS

The following points arose from the 2008 community consultation and were included in the original 2009 Cropredy Village Plan for action. Since then, they have either been completed, or it has been found that it is not possible to progress them.

1 Social and Community Issues

2 Sustainability and Green Issues

Recycling and waste	Medium	Establish feasibility of a Cropredy household battery recycling point and run a pilot scheme during 2010.	Facility now independently established at the Village Shop.
Solar power, carbon footprint and sustainable development indicators	Medium	Run a village seminar with interested groups on green energy in Cropredy during 2010.	Seminar completed

3 Buildings, New Housing and Planning

Upgrade Village Hall facilities	Completed by Village Hall Committee: New kitchen equipment; New hearing loop Completed by Cropredy Film Club: New screen and projector	Village Hall Committee responsible for further improvements.
Re-siting of Village Hall in future	Being reviewed by Village Hall Committee – time scale directionally 2015.	Closed as an action point for the VP Steering Group.
Residential caravans	No longer an issue due to closure of site.	Closed

4 Village Infrastructure

Parish Council to employ someone to keep roads and paths tidy	Parish Council unable to employ anyone (no statutory power to do so).	Closed
Provide a public toilet	Considered by Parish Council who expressed the view “not sustainable”.	Closed
Reduce power cuts	<p>Installing an uninterruptible power supply (UPS) for computers is recommended for those who rely on them.</p> <p>Anyone with priority needs (disability/ medical reliance on electricity) should register with E.ON. Leaflets and forms from Surgery or Geoff Parratt (750427).</p> <p>All faults, damage or dangerous situations should be reported: 0800 3281111.</p> <p>Supply to be monitored for any deterioration.</p>	<p>Meeting with E.ON completed. Key points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enough capacity for Cropredy’s need. • Reliability improved. • Overhead cables subject to bird and lightning damage. • Auto-reclose system restores supply in three sections. • If unsuccessful after five attempts, supply is isolated for inspection. • Auto-reclose can adversely affect computers and other electric/electronic equipment.
