1 **NOTES**

Note on responses

- 325 questionnaires delivered
- 219 returned
- 67% response rate
- 402 individuals responded (not all of them answered every question)
- Responses covered all ages from 8 years to 75+ years

Note on calculations

- Where questions are “Yes/No/Don’t know” (i.e. where each respondent had only one choice), percentages have been calculated on the total number of responses to each question.
- Where questions are multiple choice questions (i.e. where each respondent could fill in more than one choice), percentages are calculated on 402, which is the total number of individuals who filled in the survey (see above).
- At questions 7 and 8, percentages are calculated on the number of respondents to these questions.
- At question 12, percentages are calculated on the estimated number of respondents aged 11 - 9 years = 33.

Note on this summary

- All age groups have been amalgamated for the purpose of this summary, but individual answers and percentages are all contained in Appendix A.
- Many questions gave respondents the opportunity to enter free choice comments.
- These are shown in full in Appendix B (split by age groups) and Appendix C (age groups amalgamated and analysed into separate topics).
- A summary of the most frequently mentioned free choice answers is shown at every relevant question. For the full list of “one mention only” unprompted answers please refer to the relevant question in Appendix C.

2 INTRODUCTION

Background

The Cropredy Village Plan Survey was designed to gather opinions held by village residents on all the issues that were identified at the launch event in September 2007. Also taken into account within the questionnaire were matters raised by village clubs/societies and businesses operating from within the parish of Cropredy. All matters raised by the public at parish council meetings over the previous 12 months were also included, as were topics raised by individual residents in response to appeals for feedback.

Every household in the parish received a questionnaire, and a volunteer visited each house to collect the completed survey form. A response rate of 67% was achieved.

The survey results are stage one of the Cropredy Village Plan, as they demonstrate what improvements the residents think are DESIRABLE for their community in the future. The next steps will be to form volunteer groups to research the key issues identified in the survey to see which of them are AFFORDABLE and ACHIEVABLE. Projects that fulfil these criteria will be considered for inclusion in the Village Plan, which will also set out targets, actions and estimated timescales.

Structure of the Survey

The survey is organised into eight sections:

- Community
- Buildings
- Social Problems
- Traffic, parking and transportation
- New housing and planning
- Village infrastructure
- Sustainability and economy
- General

In addition to the formal questions, maximum opportunity was given for submission of unprompted views and suggestions. The volume of unprompted remarks was substantial and a total of 1,347 individual comments were received from all age groups from 8 to 75+ years old.

The answers to two questions (Numbers 26 and 28) were sorted by post code and full results of these questions are included at section 4 below.

A survey using many of the original questions was also carried out by Cropredy School and its results are included at section 5 below.

Summary of Survey Results

Community

Q6 Membership of clubs and societies

- The majority of 379 respondents (63%) belong to at least one club or society.

Q7 Children's' playground

- Of 176 responses, 88% feel that the children's' playground is adequate for 4 to 7 year olds, followed by 69% feeling it is adequate for 8 to 11 year olds.
- The top unprompted request for additional facilities at the playground was for a youth club/ improved teenager facilities. (12 out of 61 responses).

Q8 Sports field

- Of 232 responses, the adequacy of facilities for all age groups from 20 to 39 years scored more than 80% followed by 79% for 16-19 year olds.
- The top unprompted request for improved facilities at the sports field was bowls (15 out of 87 mentions), followed by 14 football-related comments and suggestions.

Q 12 Youth club

- Out of 33 possible respondents aged 11-19 years old, table tennis was the most requested activity at 55%, followed by pool and organised visits (48% each).

Q13 Activities for over 60s

- 65% per cent of 247 respondents aged 45years and over think that there are sufficient activities for the over-60s.

Q14 &15 Sports and Social Club membership

- Of the 367 answers to Q14 regarding Sports and Social Club membership, 22% were members. Of these, the majority (65%) are members of the tennis club, followed by 21% social members only, 20% cricket club members and 10% football club members.

Q16 Pavilion

- The majority 89 responses (70%) believe that the current pavilion meets the needs of their club.

Buildings

Q17 to 19 Use of Church and Chapel

- Two thirds of 389/386 respondents believe that the Church (67%) and Chapel (66%) should be used for other activities.
- Of the 514 "yes" answers to Q17 and 18, 51% believe that concerts would be appropriate, followed by meetings (38%) and clubs (37%).
- The top unprompted use suggested was classes for adults and children (11 of 33 mentions).

Q20 Use of School

63% of 378 respondents believe that the School should be used for other activities. The top out of a total of 211 unprompted suggestions was adult education at 32 mentions followed by children's clubs and activities at 28 mentions.

Q21 - 23 Village Hall

- 78% of 386 respondents use the Village Hall.
- Of 402 possible respondents, the top desired additional facility listed in the questionnaire was more parking (35%), followed by more space and better facilities (21% each).
- The top unprompted desired improvement was better kitchen facilities (10 mentions out of 83 suggestions).
- 47% of 402 possible respondents thought that the village hall should be rebuilt (when necessary) at a new site, followed by the present site (26%) and the sports field (20%).

Social Problems

Q24 Key social problems

- Based on 402 possible responses, of the options specified in the survey, dog fouling was the most cited social problem at 59%, followed by vandalism (49%), litter (48%) and anti social behaviour (42%).
- Of 91 unprompted social problems entered by respondents, the most cited were: parking (19 mentions including seven specific to the school); nuisance caused by youths (14); and speeding (13).

Q25 Community Support Officer

- The majority of 383 respondents (62%) believe that a police community support officer would help to deter anti social behaviour.

Traffic, parking and transportation

Q26 Traffic and speeding problems – by post code

- Responses sorted by post code showed that two key areas suffer from speeding: The Green (64%) and Plantation/ Station Road area (89%).

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Q27 Measure for reduction of traffic and speeding problems

- Based on 402 possible responses, of the choice of measures to reduce traffic problems and speeding suggested in the survey, illuminated signs received most support (32%), followed by radar traps (20%) and restricted parking (18%).
- Although this question focussed on speeding, the largest number of unprompted responses referred to the problems caused by parking at the school (21 of 80 responses). The second most popular unprompted suggestion was for a 20 mph speed limit through the village (11 responses).

Q 28 Parking problems – by post code

- Post code-sorted responses regarding parking problems showed that residents in three areas believe parking to be a problem: The Green (60% of residents in that area), Red Lion Street (84%); and Station Road (52%).
- Top unprompted suggestion was the School (6 of 39 answers)

Q29 More parking spaces

When given some options of areas that needed additional parking facilities, of 402 possible responses, the majority said that more parking is needed at the school (59%), followed by the village hall (39%), and the shop (27%).

Q30 Footpath from Cropredy to Great Bourton

- Of 372 answers, the majority of respondents (55%) said they would use a footpath running from Cropredy to Great Bourton.
- The most popular uses cited were leisure/pleasure/exercise (37 mentions of 127), followed by safety aspects (25 mentions) and visiting family and friends (19 mentions).

Q32 Bus Service

On the subject of a more frequent bus service to Banbury, of 376 responses 47% of said they would use it and 53% said they would not.

New housing and planning

Q32 More houses

- Of 373 responses regarding new housing being built, 46% of respondents were in favour, 43% were against and 11% answered "don't know".

Q33 Types of housing

- Out of 402 potential answers, the most popular type of housing was affordable housing for people with a village connection (39%), followed by 2-4 bedroomed houses (21%).

Q34 Style of housing

- Of 365 responses, 87% said that new developments should be in keeping with the current style of the village.

Q35 Canal boats

- Of 384 responses the majority (64%) believe that the number of residential canal boats should be limited.

Q36 Caravans

- Of 382 responses the majority of (76%) believe that the number of residential caravans should be limited.

Village infrastructure

Q37 Roads

- Of 378 responses the majority (58%) believe road infrastructure is inadequate, 26% believe it is adequate and 16% don't know.

Q38 sewage disposal/water supply

- Of 381 responses the majority (51%) say these are inadequate, 9% say adequate and 40% don't know.

Q39 Power cuts

- Of 383 responses the majority (71%) believe that power cuts are an issue, with 20% not believing they are an issue and 9% don't know.

Q40 Flooding

- Of 380 responses, the majority (81%) believe that more should be done to protect the village from flooding, with 10% against and 9% don't know.

Q41 Obstruction of pavements

- Of 384 responses, the majority (77%) of respondents want more done to keep paths free from overhanging branches and parked cars,

Q42 Untidy roads

- Of 384 responses, the majority (46%) say that roads are not untidy, 45% say they are untidy and 9 don't know.

Q43 Parish Council to employ someone to keep roads/paths tidy

- Of 236 responses, 55% agree, 28% are against and 17% don't know.

Q44 - 45 Litter problem

- Of 379 responses, 49% believe there is not a litter problem, 38% believe there is a litter problem and 13% don't know.
- Of 367 responses, 56% would help in a litter pick and 44% would not.

Q46 – 47 Street lighting

- Of 367 responses, these were evenly divided at 41% for and 42% against.
- There were 161 individual responses in favour of more street lighting in particular areas, the most popular being Station Road (17), Round Bottom (14) and New Place (12).

Q48 Public toilet

- Of 383 responses, 50% are in favour of a public toilet, 37% are against and 13% don't know.

Q49 Mobile phone coverage

- Of 393 responses, 58% want to see an improvement in mobile phone coverage, 30% don't and 12% don't know.

Sustainability and economy

Q50 – Suggestions for a greener approach

- Unprompted suggestions for ways to improve sustainability and adopt a greener approach for the village numbered 170, with the three most popular topics being recycling (26 mentions), solar power (23 mentions); and more public transport (22 mentions).

Q51 Wildlife environments

- Of 379 responses, 82% of agreed that there should be more action to preserve wildlife environments.

Q52 Use of local amenities

- Of 346 responses, 83% thought that more use of local pubs, shops and amenities should be encouraged.

Q53 - 56 Light industrial expansion/development

- Of 378 responses, 51% of respondents were against in general, with 29% in favour and 20% don't know.
- Of 371 responses, 51% were supportive if it meant more local jobs, 27% were against and 21% don't know.

- Of 377 responses, 66% were against if it generates more traffic, with 23% in favour and 11% don't know.
- Of 372 responses, 48% support light industrial development if it is kept outside the centre of the village, 36% are against and 4% don't know.

Q57 The Post Office

- Of 383 responses, 93% said that Cropredy should retain its post office facility, 3% were Against and 4% don't know.

General

Q58 Increase in council Tax to subsidise improvements

- Of 387 responses, 30% said no increase; 22% said £20, and 16% said £40, 9% said £60 and 22% don't know.

Q59 Any other comments

- 172 responses were received to the request for any further suggestions and comments. The top five topics were: housing and styles (19 mentions); youth issues (16); keep the village as it is (14); parking (12); and traffic management (11).
